

## The 2025 Sands NZ & VCA Professionals' Series runs from June to September 2025

"As professionals working with families during a time when they feel their most vulnerable, it's paramount that we know how to hold them tenderly, with our words, our presence, our support. This course gives you the tools you need to journey with those suffering loss in a way that offers light in a time of great darkness." (2023 participant)

The Professionals' Series offers four months of online learning about 20 different and important aspects of baby loss in Aotearoa NZ. (That's four months of active learning and then there's a further month to complete the content). It has been developed for anyone who interacts with or supports bereaved parents, families and whānau in a professional capacity.

The course is made up of 20 hours of online content and (optional) evening discussion webinars (two in June, one in July, one in August and two in September). The webinars alternate between hearing from bereaved parents and discussion/ networking with other course participants. As well as the course content, Vicki also offers additional content that is optional.

Dates - start on Sunday 1st June and end on Tuesday 30th September 2025. Access to the course will close on Friday 31st October 2025.
